

Llgaaygwii sdiihlda: Restoring Balance (2014 to 2018)

- Remove Sitka black-tailed deer from Ramsay Island & maintain sites of low deer densities on 5 islands
- Protect sites of key cultural significance from impacts of IAS
- Engage Canadian youth to raise awareness of Gwaii Haanas
- Increase visitor opportunities









- U.S. commitment to furthering LOI.
- MOU will strengthen and expand FWS/IC partnership.
- Allows for other partners to join effort.
- Coordinated approach through project implementation, information exchange, education and training, inventorying and monitoring.


