General Overview

- PROCER
 - PROCER is the federal government instrument for conservation and recover species at risk
 - An example of collaboration for recover species with several stakeholders
 - Use proxy species (priority, surrogate...)
 - Increase effects of management and conservation measures
 - Including management of habitat and invasive species in natural protected areas (NPA)
 - PACE: 40 (December 2014)






- PROCER

- Total projects: 174
- Common concern species:
 - California Condor.
 - Mexican Wolf.- 2 projects
 - Bison
 - Jaguar (several projects)
 - Black Tailed Prairie Dogs (2 projects)
 - Pronghorn (3 Projects: sonorensis, peninsularis, mexicana)
 - Golden Eagle
 - Marine turtles (several Projects)







- Common concern species:
 - Great White Shark
 - Whales (jorobada, rorcual común, azul)
 - Bats
 - Aplomado falcon
 - Grasslands conservation (migratory birds)
 - Rattle snakes
 - Paloma socorro
 - Beaver
 - Black Footed Ferret
 - Thick Billed Parrots
 - Black bear



Outcomes

- Continue supporting conservation actions on priority species (Mexican wolf, California condor, etc.).
- Defining strategic issues:
 - Coexistence and priority species collaboration.
 - Exchange experiences, assess and planning using species.
- Identify new opportunities to collaborate in the frame of the Trilateral Committee
 - Letter of intent with NPS and PC for North America bison conservation
 - Pollinators, planning habitat conservation based on priority species.
